Partial Outlines

Give students a partially completed outline to fill in during instruction. Keeps all learners actively engaged with the content.

2

Guided Question Handouts

Students answer guiding questions about lesson concepts in real time, building comprehension and accountability as the lesson unfolds.

3

True or False Checks

Embed True/False statements throughout instruction to prompt self-monitoring and quick formative reflection on key ideas.

4

Concept Mapping

Students build a visual concept map as the lesson progresses, making connections between ideas visible and meaningful.

5

Sketch Notes

Students capture key concepts using words and images a UDL-aligned strategy that deepens retention and engagement.

6

Focused Listening Guides

Students check off and annotate main concepts as they appear, building active listening habits and focus skills.

7

Vocabulary Scavenger Hunt

Students locate and record key vocabulary as it appears in text, slides, or discussion reinforcing academic language.

8

Pre-Reading & Pre-Teaching

A preparatory activity before the lesson activates prior knowledge and builds context, lowering barriers for all learners.

9

Video-Based Pre-Teaching

Curated videos or interactive content before or during the lesson provide additional access points and multiple means of representation.

10

Guided Note-Taking

Teach note-taking using a structured template a transferable academic skill that supports all learners across subject areas.

11

Pre-Distributed Notes

Provide lesson notes in advance so students annotate and focus on understanding rather than transcription.

12

Audio Recordings

Recordings of lesson content support processing differences, absences, and independent review for all learners.
